Reflection

As hard as I tried to discover a more stimulating golden thread in today's readings, the quote from Genesis would not let me go. "Abraham was a hundred years old when his son Isaac was born to him" (Genesis 21:5).

As my parents aged well into their eighties, one or the other would say, "I am just too old for this world." This was said when life was particularly chaotic, daunting, beyond their comprehension. Sometimes, it came from fatigue after a day of endless activity. As I have grown older, I understand this sentiment. I used to hate to go to sleep at night; it seemed a waste of time. Now, there are
