
From Today's Responsorial Psalm

My soul proclaims the greatness of the LORD,

Reflection

Luke is noted for songs within his Gospel narrative. This first song comes from Mary of Nazareth. Reference to Abraham and his descendants situates it within the Jewish-Christian tradition. Her song also contains the same "reversal theme" found in the song of Hannah, the mother of the prophet Samuel, in 1 Samuel 2:1-10. Those who dominate now will be overthrown, and the "lowly" will be exalted; those who are hungry now will have their fill, but those who are satisfied will be empty. The "greatness" of the LORD does this, i.e., restores equity and justice for all humanity, and, indeed all of creation. Yet God's greatness is not the only energy in this restoration as Luke demonstrates later in his gospel. The "lowly" respond as they fully participate by acting justly, loving tenderly, and walking humbly with their Creator.
